Hullbridge Parish Council consists of 13 Members who volunteer their time for the benefit of the Community and attend our monthly Full Council meetings, Committees, various Sub Committees and Working Groups, which together assist in the efficient smooth running of the Council.

From our Parish Council Office, the Clerk to the Council and her Team provide a service to the Community providing information to residents, in person also via our website, Facebook page and Noticeboards, we also answer an array of queries. Staff provides full administration for the day to day running of the Council, including all financial matters, Health and Safety and making sure the Council is working legally and within their remit. The Parish Council organises the popular Annual Christmas Fayre and maintains numerous footpaths and open spaces throughout the village including the management of Kendal Park Nature Reserve.

Report by the Chairman of Hullbridge Parish Council

In May 2019 I was elected Chairman and I have attended a number of events both in an official and an unofficial capacity.

Barratt David Wilson (BDW) have started the development of the site at Malyons Farm and we continue to have regular meetings with the Developer making sure Councillor and Resident concerns are raised and where possible rectified. We are pleased that our request for a War Memorial within the site has been delivered by BDW and at this year's Remembrance Service, which saw a great turnout, the new War Memorial was dedicated and blessed. BDW will be putting a cap on the Memorial also as the development progresses there will be benches and a garden of reflection.

The Village sign on the corner of Watery Lane will remain in situ as will the time capsule. We continue to work hard for the interests of residents and we have made representation on a number of outside bodies, including the Essex Coastal Forum, ECC Transport, Citizens Advice Bureau and the Rochford Hundred Association of Local Councils.

I would like to thank my Vice Chairman Cllr D Elwell and fellow Councillors for their efforts and support over the last year, also to the Clerk to the Council and her staff for the efficient administration and the maintenance around the village. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Martin Bewers the General Maintenance Officer for his service over the last 5 years who in January 2020 moved onto pastures new. General Purposes Committee

Under this Committee's remit it looks after the Parish Council's street scene assets, which includes Parish street lights, teen shelter, public seating, notice boards, bins, War Memorial, village signs, green gym, bus shelters and play equipment. The budget for 2019/2020 was £40,150.

Pooles Lane car park we are pleased that this is continuing to be free. Unfortunately, our maintenance staff are continuing to pick up a large amount of glass and rubbish left there each day. The public toilet has over the last year been hit with graffiti and anti-social activities which the Police are monitoring.

Over **220 Christmas parcels** were delivered to those residents who are 80 and over. Riverside Primary School Council kindly packed the parcels along with two residents Mr. & Mrs. Bowley – special thanks to them. We endeavor with our Management Plan to secure the future of the Reserve and make it an oasis for wildlife. Please keep all dogs on a lead in the Reserve and clear up after them.

The Recreation Ground is a great facility and is popular and enjoyed by residents and visitors. We continue to be in partnership with Rochford District Council to maintain and improve this open space. The footpath link to the Dome to provide a circular walk is still being investigated and we are hoping the scheme that Natural England and funds that RDC have just been awarded for a Coastal path project will assist us.
