#### During the month of March:

As a Community Policing Team, we have continued to work with Andy Parkman of the Community Safety Partnership (CSP) and other supporting teams, such as the Operational Support Group (OSG), The Dog Unit and Roads Policing to address matters together.

We have attended to 8 missing persons, 15 mental health related incidents, 163 ASB matters, 18 Road Traffic Collisions, stopped & searched 51 people, submitted 184 intelligence reports, attended 111 domestic abuse investigations and solved 57 crimes within the Rochford District.

By working with our partners, we have secured a number of locations across the district for beat surgeries in order to remain visible and accessible to local residents. We, along with the Positive Action Team (For the last two), will be on hand to provide crime prevention and safety advice at the following places, between the below times, so please 'Save the Day' and pop along to meet us:

**Royal Mail Scam - Undelivered Parcel Text Messages!** The public are being warned to stay alert to a new wave of scam text messages claiming to be from parcel delivery organisations such as the Royal Mail, DHL, DPD, Amazon, etc... Criminals are taking advantage of the new reliance on online shopping and deliveries to obtain personal and banking details.

Please see, consider, and follow our simple steps of advice.

## Some simple steps you can take are:

- **BE WARY** of unexpected messages, these should be treated with caution.
- **NEVER** click on links contained within messages, that suggest parcels could not be delivered and are suggestive of a small fee being required.
- **STOP:** Take a moment and remember, Royal Mail have stated that this is not a text they would send out, and they will only send text messages to those who have opted into their SMS service.
- **CHALLENGE:** Phone numbers can be easily spoofed by criminals—don't trust a number just because it appears to come from a genuine organisation.
- **PROTECT:** If you are elderly or vulnerable, call us on 101 (999 in an emergency). if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud, via www.actionfraud.police.uk or 0300 123 2040.
