What do Councillors do?

You don't need any previous experience to be a

Councillor, just an interest and views on your local area. There are over 80,000 local councillors in England, They as a council are able to

- Speak on behalf of their Community
- Have a say about local issues
- Influence local services
- Decide how local money can be spent in the community
- Organise community events.

Councillors are usually voted in at Elections , unless a vacancy occurs on the council mid-term, when a co-option onto the council will take place.

Can I be a Councillor ?

To apply to be a Parish Councillor you must be;

- Over 18 years of age.
- For at least 12 months lived in or within 3 miles of the Parish or worked within the Parish
- Be a UK or Commonwealth citizen.

The Council

Hullbridge Parish Council comprises of 13 volunteer Councillors some elected some co-opted. Councillors are split into two wards , Riverside Ward and South Ward.

The full council meets once a month . Committees of the council which cover Finance, Environment and Planning as well as Events and Leisure also meet regularly . The council has powers to act and spend money for the benefit of the community.
