Report by the Chairman of Hullbridge Parish Council

In May 2023 I was elected Chair in what is the 60th year of Hullbridge Parish Council. We have been busy during the past year with various community events, and along with the whole country celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III, planting a commemorative tree in Kendal Park with children from **Riverside Primary and** installing a new bench in the Rose Gardens. Grant funding was given to local groups to help celebrate this event. We also attended the school Summer Fete with our popular Human Fruit Machine, which had a reprise at our Christmas Fayre. We are continuing our Hullbridge Goes Green Initiative, installing two solar lampposts with a roll out of LED lights to follow from 2024. We will be running a new version of our Best Kept Front Garden Competition with biodiversity in mind. Our hardworking maintenance staff have been busy replacing three footbridges in the village and helping the Allotment site create a communal area for

plot holders, including a new wooden bench provided by the council where allotment holders can swap seeds, equipment, and ideas! They have also helped keep our open spaces safe after storm damage and have replanted flowers and bulbs all around the village. We have been lucky enough to get funding for a Bleed Kit which is now on the wall outside the Parish

The Parish Council continues to support many local groups and charities with grants to enable them to deliver important services to the local community. Our free wheelchair hire continues to be one of our most valued services and often helps support residents at difficult times. I would like to thank my fellow Councillors and all the Parish Council staff for their continued support and hard work in helping to keep Hullbridge a fantastic place to live.
