One such event was the Senior Safety Day which was held in January and I along with other Councillors took part in various sessions including Tai Chi, the Clerk had a Parish Council information stall along with health providers such as Age Concern. This event was very successful and enjoyed by many of our older residents. Malyons Farm Development which has outline planning permission is a concern to residents and we will continue to make representation to get the best for this Community. The Remembrance Services are very important to the Parish Council and this year we laid wreaths at the Hullbridge / Rayleigh / Hockley Services. <u>Finance/ Policy /</u> <u>Appointments Committee</u>

The Parish Council strives to achieve "Best Value" for all its expenditure, whilst abiding by our financial regulations ensuring we get good value for money and obtaining the most competitive prices.

We have a 5 year Financial Forecast and Action Plan and have adopted and updated our Policies and Procedures. Our budget for 2016/2017 was £132,064 and this was spent on a number of responsibilities.

Some of which were:

- Floral baskets
- Allotments
- Free use of Pooles Lane car park
- Managing and maintaining Kendal Nature Reserve, emergency work due to Ash Tree Die Back
- Events including the Christmas Fayre
- Street lighting in un-adopted roads
- CCTV in the car park and Ferry Road
- Maintenance of street furniture, Rose Garden, village Memorial, some grass verges and footpaths (5/12).
- Opening of the Recreation Ground Toilets (April-October)
- Play Ground Improvements

The Parish Council also continues to provide support to a number of organisations including Heart-Watch, Riverside Primary School PTA and Citizens Advice Bureau. We do have a **grant scheme** where organisations can apply http://www.hullbridgepc.co.uk/grant-assistance-application-f/

Grant Funding - We have actively sought grant funding and we were successful in securing funding for the Recreation Ground for a replacement fishing play boat. This has been a joint project with Essex County Council (Communities Initiative Fund), Rochford District Council and

the Parish Council. We had hoped that this would have been installed for Easter 2017 but it has been slightly delayed due to installation issues. We feel this is a great asset to the Recreation Ground which is enjoyed by many residents and visitors.

General Purposes Committee

Under this Committee's remit it looks after the Parish Council's street scene assets, which includes Parish street lights, teen shelter, public seating, notice boards, bins, War Memorial, village sign and bus shelters.

Pooles Lane car park we are pleased that this is continuing to be free and we have also reduced the height of the hedging around the car park for safety reasons.

Unfortunately our maintenance staff are continuing to pick up a large amount of rubbish left there each day.

Over 170 Christmas parcels were delivered to the elderly residents, contributions were given by Riverside Primary School and the School Council kindly packed them.

Allotments The Allotments located in Lower Road are enjoyed by many with every

plot taken, please forward your name to the Clerk if you would like to go onto our waiting list.

We have been in talks with ECC Youth Service to see if this building can be utilised more and be an asset for the whole Community.
Unfortunately due to the Youth Services current age restrictions its use is proving difficult but we hope in the near future this issue can be

remedied.

Hullbridge Parish Council continues to maintain the plants along Ferry Road and last year's baskets provided a lovely floral display.

<u>Parks / Open Spaces /</u> <u>Conservation / Footpaths</u> Committee

Over the last two years there has been significant improvements made to the Recreation Ground and Play Area providing new play equipment for all ages, seating/picnic tables and a sun canopy, this park is very popular and used by many. We are in discussions with Rochford District Council regarding the old Pavilion and its future and we are continuing to fund the opening of the toilets as we appreciate this is a necessity for users of the park but we hope that we can make improvements to the toilet facility.

The Committee has been working with Hockley Parish Council / Landowners to have a footpath link to the Dome providing a circular walk, this unfortunately hasn't come into fruition but we are hoping the scheme that Natural England are currently running to reinstate coastal walks might be able to assist us.

Kendal Park NR is managed by the Parish Council and we have a Management Plan in place to secure the future of the Reserve. We have had to carry out coppicing work due to Ash Tree Die Back. Over the last 2 years we have planted nearly 400 whips but sadly a large number of these have been vandalised. It is so important the Reserve species are diversified for the Reserve to exist in the future as currently 90 % is Ash. Wildlife is abundant in the Reserve and specialised teams have carried out surveys.

The Community Pay Back Team assisted our staff with laying cockle shell along the main footpath which has been very beneficial.

We have also made improvements to the entrances of the Reserve and opened up the Smugglers Den Entrance. In the near future with the assistance from the local Scout Group we will be putting up bird/bat/owl boxes and installing a "bug hotel".
